Reflection:

Jeremiah had a very difficult calling to be God's prophet as at the time Israel was not in a good place with God. His ministry was to bring people back to God and repent of their sins.

They had forgotten who had brought them out of Egypt in a miraculous way. They had forsaken God. All the leaders rejected God's law and will for the people.

For a very long time we have been going through so many changes as a country. Brexit, covid, strikes and now the heating and fuel crisis.

God has NOT FORSAKEN US!

He has been with us all through everything. God was with his people who Jeremiah was to prophesy too.

When we pray to God he does listen. We always begin our prayers by asking God to Forgive us. We can then go into his holy presence in Jesus' name.

We can be persistent in prayer that is what the widow in Luke 18 did kept going to the judge. If that unjust judge responds to pressure how much more will a loving God respond to us?

As in the hymn we have just sung 'I place into your hands the things the trouble me' and 'I place into your your hands my friends and family.' We don't need to keep repeating ourselves in prayer. Keep your heart open to God and you will know when to stop praying for a situation or person which has been laid on your heart because God WILL give you peace in your heart about it no matter what his answer is.

Remember what God has done for you through your lives or when you came to know Jesus. When Jeremiah prophesied to his people, they did not take any notice. They blamed their forefathers and their sins. But it was their own sin which was making God angry. God said he would put his laws in their mind and write it on their hearts.

He wants our hearts and minds to be filled with his love and to trust in him to see us through this difficulty in our lives and in our nation. But we must come in prayer to him that he can turn our nations hearts to him. **Amen**
